At 4:00 PM upon arrival from the airport departure of Thai Prime Minister Tansu Kruvin-Xen, I was able to pass through a telephone call through the unreliable Libyan communications system.

Pres. Marcos privately told me that last night at 8:00 PM Libya time which would be 5:00 AM Manila time, immediately after the call of Guelde to Pres. Ghadafi, he was called to the Presidents house where after he explained that the term "under oath in accordance with our constitutional processes" meant a plebiscite, but upon the query of Pres. Ghadafi as to whether this included the question of local autonomy, that the question to be answered was only whether this province or that wanted to belong to one region or another.

The Barber further told Pres. Ghadafi that the Pres. Marcos had promised to give local autonomy to the Isulin provinces, he was going to do so, but the constitution required the President to ask the people whether they wanted to be in one region or the other.
