Taiwan. But he sounded too talkative and  
loquacious as if he were trying to convince  
himself about what he was saying.

Sen. Sumulong, Tames, Bonting, Perez,

tation this morning. Sen. Padilla had to leave  
at 11:00 AM as he had an appointment.  
But there is an agreement to which the executive  
members are parties (including Sen. Masceda  
and Ray) that there would be a meeting
