or "Ang Makarika" Sunday

We escaped the loneliness of the palace for this old Antillian house now known as Ang Makarika, the State Guest House several blocks from the palace. It has been restored beautifully by Imelda and is a symbol of Philippines culture in the last century. Almost all our antique valuables have been transferred here.

The departure of our children has made the palace a ghoulish unbearable place.

I took a long nap (4:30 - 7:30 P.M.) in the room of Bongbong which has the worst bed (biceps) and the lumpiest mattress.

And after an early simple dinner of sardines and potato, I was able to browse in the library where to my delight I discovered the books I have been wanting to read for some time - including FitzGrenians, The Kennedy ~~Pattine~~ Legend, Stevenson's The Kennedy Legend, The Thirty Years edited by Donald Johnson (Some of the principles and lessons outmoded), Days of Fire by Samuel Ketyl (The Secret History of the Agency Kwei Jeumi and the Masay of Israel, Chou-an-lai by Kai-Yu Ho Room 39 by Donald McFadzean (The room of the British Secret Intelligence in WW II), the History of the World in the 20th Century by Witt, Spencer and Brown.

For some of the other leaders have been dealing with the Communists - Matala, Yap, Dela Pena, Dy, Pendatun, Sucwan etc.

Antonio Zuñeta, news editor of the Bulletin had an explanation of his Trade Asia activities in today's paper. He adopts an aggressive stance of short measure!

The Air Manila plane was apparently
bombed at 4:40 AM yesterday by a grenade
in a valise with incendiary bombs over Roxas
prepared to ditch because of the right engine being
out of commission from the grenade blast but
was able to limp up to Foxes City where it landed
at about 5:00 AM in the dark with nothing but its
landing lights to guide it. Capt. Samonte the
captain of the plane did a good job as was lucky.
